

Currency: euro

Region known as Gaul

Julius Caesar of Rome conquered Gaul 58 BCE

Became a province of Rome

Franks unified the area after the fall of Rome (486 CE)

Vikings est. Normandy in 911 CE

100 Years War between England & France 1337-1453 CE

England wanted to control France

French Revolution...

Perceived excesses of the royals led to the people rising up (1789)

King Louis XIV & Queen Marie Antoinette beheaded 1793

Napoleon named himself emperor of France 1804

He expanded French empire but was defeated by British & Russia

End of the monarchy...

1848

A few tried later to reinstate it, but it never stuck

WWI

U.K., France, & Russia were "Allied Forces" vs. Germany & Austria-Hungary

France suffered huge casualties

Hitler's Invasion 1940

-revenge for France's involvement in WWI
-keep France (& Britain) from stopping him
from capturing the easter European countries
he wanted


Storming Normandy... "D-Day"
